






SUSTAINABILITY

- Data from the U.S. Energy Information Agency suggests that buildings constructed before 1920 are actually more energy-efficient than buildings built during the last half of the century. Furthermore, in 1999, the General Services Administration (GSA) examined its buildings inventory and found that utility costs for historic buildings were 27% less than for more modern buildings.
- It takes 35-50 years to replace the resources used to build a new energy efficient building.




